

GENERAL ORDER NO. 20

COURT REPORTER SERVICES FOR MAGISTRATES

It appearing to the Court that there is a need to provide official court reporter services to magistrates in San Francisco, IT IS ORDERED,

1. That the four full time San Francisco magistrates be included among the judicial officers receiving official court reporter services on a rotation basis;

2. That a rotation schedule shall be prepared from time to time as needed, to be approved by the Liaison Judge for Court Reporters and filed with the Clerk effectuating the provisions of this General Order;

3. That the following rotation schedule shall be in effect commencing August 18, 1981, and until revised in accordance with paragraph 2 of this General Order:

* Letters A through G designate the official reporters available for rotation service.

4. That at any time there is an insufficient number of official court reporters to service the needs of all the judicial officers receiving court reporter services on a rotation basis, contract reporters will be provided for the magistrates so that official reporters will be available for District Judges.
