GENERAL ORDER NO. 49

ADMISSION TO THE BAR PRO HAC VICE

- 1. Application. An attorney who is not a member of the bar of this Court may apply to appear pro hac vice in a particular action in this district by filing a written application provided by the Clerk's Office and by paying a \$60.00 fee. By signing the application, the attorney shall certify:
 - A. That he or she is an active member in good standing of the bar of a United States Court or of the highest court of another State or the District of Columbia, specifying such bar;
 - B. That he or she agrees to abide by the Standards of Professional Conduct set forth in the Civil Local Rules, and to become familiar with the Alternative Dispute Resolution Programs of this Court;
 - C. That an attorney who is a member of the bar of this Court in good standing and who maintains an office within the State of California is designated as co-counsel, and the name of designated counsel.
- 2. Approval. The Clerk shall present the application to the assigned Judge for approval. The assigned Judge shall have discretion to accept or reject the application. If the Judge rejects the application, the attorney shall, upon request, have the \$60.00 fee refunded.
- 3. Admission Fee. The \$60.00 fee shall be placed in the Court Non-Appropriated Fund for library, educational and other appropriate uses.
- 4. Appearance. All papers filed by the attorney shall indicate appearance pro hac vice. Service of papers upon and communications with co-counsel designated pursuant to this General Order shall constitute notice to the party.
